Things you should do after attending a conference











Throughout the week you were probably overloaded with a lot of information that you need to digest over the next few weeks. Keeping these tips in mind will help you implement some of the things you have learned:

Network even after the event

The conference might be over, but the networking is just beginning. At the event you inevitably ran into acquaintances, peers or businesses that you want to find out more about. Now it's time to put those newfound contacts to use. While it's still fresh in everyone's mind, follow up with an email that might sound something like "Hey, we talked at the 2017 SAAA/IAAER/AAFA conference, and I really wanted to get in touch about..."

Brain dump

Conferences can be hectic, even the most organised note takers can end up with chicken scratch and scribbled shorthand that become completely indecipherable once some time has passed. Shortly after the conference, while things are still fresh, take an hour to sit down and unload all of your thoughts onto paper. Also flesh out any notes you did take to make sure they are clear to you. This will help preserve anything that didn't get written down or that was written down in haste for later reference.

Update LinkedIn

Gather all the business cards that you have collected during the event and within a few days after the conference, follow up with those whom you feel could be valuable contacts. The most obvious place to connect is on LinkedIn, where most professionals have come to expect connection requests post-conference. Remember to write a personalised salutation so they are able to connect the dots on how you met. You'd be surprised at how often these contacts will come in handy if you're utilizing your network regularly. If you really bonded with someone in particular don't hesitate to send them a text message or give them a call directly.

Reflect on your conference goals

Did you get to visit all the booths you wanted to see? Did you get to the sessions that were most important to you? If you had certain goals for the conference, take some time to think about what it was you wanted to achieve, and if you didn't get a chance to do a training session or visit a partner's booth, look for ways that you can fill that gap. Perhaps plan for another conference that you can attend in the near future.
