SUBMISSION OF PAPERS AND ABSTRACTS:

Papers are called for in the following areas of Accounting and related disciplines:

- Accounting Education
- Auditing (including Internal Auditing, External Auditing, Corporate Governance, Information Systems, Computer Auditing and Ethics)
- Financial Accounting (including Financial Reporting, Integrated Reporting, and Social and Environmental Accounting)
- Financial Management (including Management Accounting and Finance)
- Public Sector Accounting and Non-Profit Accounting
- Taxation (including Social, Environmental and International Taxation)

Papers will be accepted and presented in two categories:

Track 1 Refereed:	Manuscripts (research papers) of a sufficient academic standard to be subjected to a double blind review process.
Track 2 Non-refereed:	Manuscripts that will not be refereed. A manuscript should comprise of an abstract only.

Refereed papers (Track 1) and/or Abstracts (Track 2) must be electronically submitted before 10 June 2024 to gyoung@ufh.ac.za after completion of the Google form <https://forms.gle/rjDtQgkZgkSfg12J6>. The submission must clearly indicate which track and subject areas are applicable.

Letters of acceptance or rejection will be sent timeously after receipt of the abstract or paper, but no later than **23 August 2024**. Final papers conforming to the refereed feedback requirements must be re-submitted electronically before 3 September 2024 to gyoung@ufh.ac.za.

A maximum of 40% of papers from a single institution will be allowed in Track 1 for publication in the conference proceedings. This will be proactively monitored and communicated to authors and/or institutions as required.

AUTHOR GUIDELINES

Papers or abstracts that do not comply with the required criteria will not be considered.

Track 1

Papers for conference proceedings should be limited to 5 000 – 8 000 words, including the reference list, with an abstract of between 150 and 250 words and 6-8 keywords.

- The paper heading should be Arial 14 with text Arial 12 using 1.5 spacing throughout the document. The headings in the paper for the different sub-sections, such as abstract and introduction should be in caps and bold, with any further headings only in bold.
- There should be no numbering for the headings.
- All references should use the Harvard referencing method.
- 2.5cm page margins should be used on all sides.
- Submissions must be in MS-Word format (not PDF).
- Paper submissions must include a cover page and the paper.
 - The cover page should be a separate document that includes the title of the paper, the name and surname of the authors and the respective university the authors are affiliated to, along with the email address of the corresponding author.
 - The paper should include the title of the paper, the abstract and the details of the paper but should not have any reference to the authors.

A PRIZE WILL BE AWARDED FOR THE BEST REFEREED PAPER.

Track 2

Abstract submissions can be between one and two pages and should contain:

- Title and indicate the topic area.
- Scope of the work showing the main aim and purpose of the study.
- Previous research and theoretical background.
- Significant data and methodology used or planned to be used for ongoing research.
- Major findings and conclusions, where relevant or expectations for ongoing research.
- Implications of research and future research areas.
